THE PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER of the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia (“ECCC”);

NOTING its Decision on Public Hearing dated 9 October 2007 announcing that the hearing in the appeal against the Provisional Detention Order of 31 July 2007 by the charged person KAING Guek Eav will be conducted in public;
