

**SUBJECT:** Decision on NUON Chea Defence and KHIEU Samphan Defence Internal Rule 87(4) requests related to the testimony of expert Alexander HINTON (2-TCE-88)

1. The Trial Chamber is seised of an Internal Rule 87(4) request from the NUON Chea Defence (“NUON Chea Request”) to admit 17 documents related to the upcoming testimony of Alexander HINTON (2-TCE-88), filed 3 March 2016 (E387). The Chamber is also seised of the KHIEU Samphan Defence’s Internal Rule 87(4) request (“KHIEU Samphan Request”) to admit six documents related to Mr. HINTON’s expected testimony, filed 4 March 2016 (E387/1). The Chamber heard the oral responses to these motions during court proceedings on 7 March 2016.

2. The Chamber notes that both the NUON Chea Defence and the KHIEU Samphan Defence filed corrections affecting the numbering of the annexes to the NUON Chea Request and the KHIEU Samphan Request. In the instant decision, the Chamber uses the corrected annex numbers.

3. With respect to the NUON Chea Request, the Trial Chamber partially grants the request and admits into evidence the following documents (newly assigned document numbers in brackets):

4. The Chamber rejects the NUON Chea Request with respect to documents E387.1.15 (“Problems of International Codification – Were the Atrocities in Cambodia and Kosovo Genocide?”, William A. Schabas, *New England Law Review*, 2001) and E387.1.16 (“Seeking justice for the killing fields”, Alex Hinton, *New York Times*, 31 May 2006).

5. With respect to the KHIEU Samphan Request, the Trial Chamber admits into evidence the following documents:

- a. E387/1.3 (E3/9717) – “Yes, indeed! Why did they kill (so many)?”, Henri Locard, *Phnom Penh Post*, 9 September 2005;

6. The Chamber notes that E387/1.1, E387/1.2 and E387/1.4 have been admitted into evidence at paras 3.a., 3.i., and 3.j. – respectively, E3/9702, E3/9710, and E3/9711.
7. Written reasons for this decision will be issued in due course.
