

DECISION TO STRIKE OUT

The Human Rights Chamber for Bosnia and Herzegovina, sitting as the First Panel on 11 October 2000 with the following members present:

Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(3) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

- 1. The application was introduced on 24 April 2000 and registered on the same day.
- 2. The applicant alleges a violation of Articles 6 and 8 of the European Convention and Article 1 of Protocol 1 to the European Convention.
- 3. On 29 May 2000 the Chamber rejected the applicant's request for review and sent a letter to her, asking him to inform the Chamber within one month whether she wanted to continue with her application before the Chamber. No response was received.
- 4. On 19 July 2000 the Registry sent a registered letter to the applicant asking her to reply within 3 weeks. The applicant received the letter. No response was received.

II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER

5. Having regard to Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, the Chamber finds that the applicant does not intend to pursue the application. Furthermore, the Chamber finds no special circumstances regarding respect for human rights which require the examination of the application to be continued. It follows that the application must be struck out of the list.

III. CONCLUSION

6. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,
