Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(2)(a) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The application was introduced on 14 November 2000. The applicant's members are being prosecuted on charge of participation in a group obstructing officials in the execution of their official activity. The applicant requested that the Chamber order a provisional measure to terminate the criminal proceedings against its members. On 8 December 2000 the Chamber decided not to order the provisional measure.
- 2. The applicant states that the criminal proceedings against its members are illegal and degrading.

II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER

3. The Chamber notes that the applicant as an Association is not a victim of a violation of human rights. Further, even if every member authorised the Association to act on their behalf, they still would not have exhausted domestic remedies as the proceedings are still pending before the Municipal Court in Zenica. The domestic remedies have therefore not been exhausted as required by Article VIII(2)(a) of the Agreement. It follows that the application must be rejected.

III. CONCLUSION

4. For these reasons, the Chamber, by 5 votes to 1,

DECLARES THE APPLICATION INADMISSIBLE.
