Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(2)(c) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

#### I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The application was introduced on 6 November 2000. The applicant requested that the Chamber order a provisional measure to take all necessary action to prevent her eviction. The Chamber rejected this request on 6 November 2000.
- 2. The applicant complains of a decision of the Administration for Housing Affairs of Canton Sarajevo entitling the pre-war occupant to regain possession of the apartment currently occupied by the applicant at ul.Zmaja od Bosne 41 in Sarajevo.

#### II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER

3. The Chamber notes that the decision in question was taken to allow the pre-war occupancy right holder to repossess the apartment and that the applicant has no legal right to occupy the apartment. In these circumstances and In light of all the material in its possession, the Chamber finds that the application does not disclose any appearance of a violation of the rights and freedoms guaranteed under the Agreement. It follows that the application must be rejected as manifestly ill-founded, in accordance with Article VIII(2)(c) of the Agreement.

#### III. CONCLUSION

4. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,

#### **DECLARES THE APPLICATION INADMISSIBLE.**
