



DECISION TO STRIKE OUT

Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(3)(b) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The application was introduced on 24 January 1998. The applicant complained that the respondent Parties had enacted laws which retroactively annulled all contracts on purchase of apartments from the former JNA. The applicant concluded such a contract on 14 February 1992.

2. On 19 June 2001 the Chamber sent the applicant's representative a letter by registered mail asking whether the applicant had succeeded in registering his ownership of the disputed apartment. In his letter submitted on 6 July 2001, the applicant informed the Chamber that he had finalised his case in his favour and registered himself before the Municipal Court in Tuzla. The applicant considered the matter as resolved.

II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER

3. In accordance with Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, "the Chamber may decide at any point in its proceedings to suspend consideration of, reject or strike out, an application on the ground that ... (b) the matter has been resolved; ... provided that such a result is consistent with the objective of respect for human rights."

4. Having regard to Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, the Chamber finds that the matter raised in the application has been resolved. Furthermore, the Chamber finds no special circumstances regarding respect for human rights which require the examination of the application to be continued. It follows that the application may be struck out of the list.

III. CONCLUSION

5. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,

STRIKES OUT THE APPLICATION.
