Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(3)(b) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

I. INTRODUCTION

- The application was introduced on 26 January 2000.
- 2. The applicant complained of his inability to repossess his pre-war apartment, located at Trg djece Dobrinje no. 5, in Sarajevo.
- 3. On 13 June 2001, based on information transmitted by the Commission for Real Property Claims of Displaced Persons and Refugees, the Chamber requested the applicant to confirm his reinstatement into his apartment.
- 4. On 20 June 2001 the applicant transmitted to the Chamber a copy of the record of the Administration for Housing Affairs, Sarajevo Canton stating that the applicant has been reinstated into his property on 12 May 2000.

II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER

- 5. In accordance with Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, "the Chamber may decide at any point in its proceedings to suspend consideration of, reject or strike out, an application on the ground that ... (b) the matter has been resolved; ... provided that such a result is consistent with the objective of respect for human rights."
- 6. Considering that the applicant has been reinstated into possession of his apartment, the Chamber finds that the matter raised in the application has been resolved. Furthermore, the Chamber finds no special circumstances regarding respect for human rights which require the examination of the application to be continued. The Chamber therefore decides to strike out the application.

III. CONCLUSION

7. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,

STRIKES OUT THE APPLICATION.
