



## **DECISION TO STRIKE OUT**

Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(3)(b) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

## **I. INTRODUCTION**

1. The application was registered on 14 August 2000.
2. The applicant complained of her inability to repossess her pre-war apartment, located at Ulica Envera Šehovića no. 26/7, in Sarajevo.
3. On 7 May 2001 the application was transmitted to the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina ("the Federation"). On 21 June 2001 the Federation submitted its observations on admissibility and merits of the application.
4. On 10 September 2001 the respondent Party informed the Chamber that the applicant was reinstated into her apartment on 13 July 2001.
5. On 8 October 2001 the applicant confirmed to the Chamber that she had been reinstated into her property.

## **II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER**

6. In accordance with Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, "the Chamber may decide at any point in its proceedings to suspend consideration of, reject or strike out, an application on the ground that ... (b) the matter has been resolved; ... provided that such a result is consistent with the objective of respect for human rights."
7. Considering that the applicant has been reinstated into possession of her apartment, the Chamber finds that the matter raised in the application has been resolved. Furthermore, the Chamber finds no special circumstances regarding respect for human rights which require the examination of the application to be continued. The Chamber therefore decides to strike out the application.

## **III. CONCLUSION**

8. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,

**STRIKES OUT THE APPLICATION.**
