

## **DECISION TO STRIKE OUT**

Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant Article VIII(3)(a) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

#### I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The application was introduced on 15 October 1999 and registered on the same day.
- 2. The applicant complained of his inability to repossess his pre-war apartment, located at Ulica Behdžeta Mutevelića 47/I, in Sarajevo.
- 3. On 7 February 2003, the applicant informed the Chamber that he had been reinstated into possession of his pre-war apartment on the 9 January 2001 and that as a result, he wishes to withdraw his application.

#### II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER

- 4. In accordance with Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, "the Chamber may decide at any point in its proceedings to suspend consideration of, reject or strike out, an application on the ground that (a) the applicant does not intend to pursue his application; ... provided that such a result is consistent with the objective of respect for human rights."
- 5. The Chamber notes that the applicant lodged his application with a view to regaining possession of his pre-war apartment, and while his case was still pending before the Chamber, he regained such possession. The Chamber further notes that the applicant stated in his correspondence that as a result of his repossession, he does not intend to pursue his application. Considering his statement, the Chamber finds that the applicant does not intend to pursue his application. Furthermore, the Chamber finds no special circumstances regarding respect for human rights which require the examination of the application to be continued. The Chamber therefore decides to strike out the application, pursuant to Article VIII(3)(a) of the Agreement.

#### III. CONCLUSION

6. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,
