Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(2)(c) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The application was introduced on 22 February 2001 and registered on the same day. The applicant requested that the Chamber order to the respondent Party, as a provisional measure, to take all necessary action to prevent his eviction from a house of which he is the temporary user. On 7 March 2001, the Chamber decided not to order the provisional measure requested.

2. The applicant complains of a decision of the Ministry for Refugees and Displaced Persons in Prijedor dated 8 September 2000, and two decisions dated 7 February 2001 (the house concerned is in joint ownership) ordering his eviction from a house which he occupies.

II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER

3. The Chamber notes that the decisions in question were taken to allow the pre-war owners to repossess the house and that the applicant has no legal right to occupy the house. In these circumstances and in the light of all the material in its possession, the Chamber finds that the application does not disclose any appearance of a violation of the rights and freedoms guaranteed under the Agreement. It follows that the application must be rejected as manifestly ill-founded, in accordance with Article VIII(2)(c) of the Agreement.

III. CONCLUSION

4. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,

DECLARES THE APPLICATION INADMISSIBLE.
