Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement (“the Agreement”) set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(3)(a) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber’s Rules of Procedure:

## **I INTRODUCTION**

1. The application was introduced on 6 December 2001.
2. The applicant is a doctor who lives at Ulica Grbavička 127 B, Grbavica, in Sarajevo. The case concerns the attempts of the applicant to be re-employed by her pre-war employer “Public Institution Health Centre Sarajevo”, located at the Municipality Center in Sarajevo.
3. On 15 January 2003, the applicant informed the Chamber that she would like to withdraw her application because her case was resolved to her satisfaction by her employer.

## **II OPINION OF THE CHAMBER**

4. In accordance with Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, “the Chamber may decide at any point in its proceedings to suspend consideration of, reject or strike out, an application on the ground that... (a) the applicant does not intend to pursue his application; ... provided that such a result is consistent with the objective of respect for human rights.”
5. The Chamber notes that the applicant has informed it that she would like to withdraw her application because the matter raised in the application has been resolved to her satisfaction. Furthermore, the Chamber finds no special circumstances regarding respect for human rights which require the examination of the application to be continued. The Chamber therefore decides to strike out the application.

## **III. CONCLUSION**

6. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,

**STRIKES THE APPLICATION OUT.**
