



## **DECISION TO STRIKE OUT**

Having considered the aforementioned application introduced pursuant to Article VIII(1) of the Human Rights Agreement ("the Agreement") set out in Annex 6 to the General Framework Agreement for Peace in Bosnia and Herzegovina;

Adopts the following decision pursuant to Article VIII(3)(b) of the Agreement and Rules 49(2) and 52 of the Chamber's Rules of Procedure:

**I. INTRODUCTION**

1. The application was introduced on 11 February 1998.
2. The case concerns the attempts of the applicant to register his ownership over an apartment located at Ulica Slatina 3/9-38 in Tuzla.
3. On 1 June 2001 the respondent Party informed the Chamber that the applicant, had registered his ownership rights over his property with the land registry in the Municipal Court in Tuzla. On 26 June 2001 the respondent Party's observations were transmitted to the applicant for his confirmation and possible comments. The applicant did not reply.

**II. OPINION OF THE CHAMBER**

4. In accordance with Article VIII(3) of the Agreement, "the Chamber may decide at any point in its proceedings to suspend consideration of, reject or strike out, an application on the ground that... (b) the matter has been resolved; ... provided that such a result is consistent with the objective of respect for human rights."
5. Considering that the applicant registered his ownership rights over the apartment, and that he did not reply to the Chamber's letter, the Chamber finds that the matter raised in the application has been resolved. Furthermore, the Chamber finds no special circumstances regarding respect for human rights which require the examination of the application to be continued. The Chamber therefore decides to strike out the application.

**III. CONCLUSION**

6. For these reasons, the Chamber, unanimously,

**STRIKES THE APPLICATION OUT.**
