[1] Case 1781. October 22, 1973, denouncing various specific violations of the following rights embodied in the American Declaration: right to life, to liberty, to personal security and the integrity, to protection against arbitrary arrest and to due process (Articles I, XXV and XXVI respectively).

[2] In accordance with the decision taken at the thirty-first session (October 1973), the Commission transmitted to the Government of Colombia in a note dated December 19, 1973, the pertinent parts of the report and requested information (Articles 42 and 44 of the Rules of Procedure). This request for information was repeated on June 3, 1974.

[3] As in cases 1777 and 1780, the Commission granted the Government of Colombia, in accordance with the decision adopted at the thirty-fourth session (October 1974), an additions extension of 60 days for the presentation of the information requested and postponed the examination of the case.
