[1] 1856, presented through a communication dated July 29, 1974, denounces the arrest and disappearance in Santiago of Mr. Alvaro Modesto Vallejos, a Chilean citizen. In a note of July 31, the Commission requested the Government of Chile to provide the appropriate information.

[2] In a note of January 14, 1975 (No. 1047), the Government of Chile replied, reporting that the individual alleged to have disappeared, Mr. Vallejos, had been released by virtue of D.E. No. 349.

[3] The Commission examined case 1856 during its thirty-fifth session (May 1975) and decided to file the case without further processing. In a letter of August 12, the claimant was informed of this decision.
