50. On November 21, 1999, the Commission granted precautionary measures on behalf of journalist Guillermo González Arica, in the context of case 12.085. The Commission had received information in relation to repeated acts of persecution against Mr. González Arica, allegedly by security agents of the State of Peru. The measures which the State of Peru was requested to adopt were based on the need to enable Mr. González Arica to fully exercise his freedom of expression. On December 21, 1999, the State responded to the Commission's request by stating that it did not consider it necessary to adopt additional measures to those that were already contemplated in the national legislation.
