On April 4, 2000, the Commission granted precautionary measures on behalf of Franz Britton, better known as Collie Wills, who allegedly disappeared on January 27, 2000, following his detention on January 25, 2000. The Commission requested that the Government of Guyana take the necessary measures to ensure respect for Mr. Britton's life and to present information on the facts that gave rise to this petition filed with the inter-American system. Through letters dated August 24, 2000 and February 4, 2001, the Commission reiterated its request for information on the case, but has not received a reply from the State.
