On December 16, 2000, the Commission granted precautionary measures on behalf of Alexander Williams (case 12.348), sentenced to death in the State of Georgia, requesting that the State stay the execution of Mr. Williams in order to investigate the allegations brought before the inter-American system, on the grounds that executing him before the Commission investigated the case would cause irreparable harm. The State did not reply to the Commission's request.
