On September 19, 2006, the IACHR granted precautionary measures in favor of Arabella del Carmen Jiménez Sánchez, Daniel Iván García Manrique, Verónica Galicia Castro, Esperanza Aurora Rascón Córdoba, and Oscar Reséndiz Galván, all journalists or workers at the “La Voladora” radio station. The available information states that the journalists and workers at “La Voladora” have been subjected to threats and attacks because of their work as journalists. In view of the information, the Commission requested that the Government of Mexico adopt the measures necessary to protect the life and physical integrity of the beneficiaries and report on action taken to investigate judicially the events that gave rise to the precautionary measures. The IACHR is monitoring the beneficiaries’ situation.
