Dear Bruno,

Thank you for your letter. I am surprised to learn that you took actions which affect the OTP's operations and had communications with the Presidency and the Chambers without "consultations with the Prosecutor", as required by Rule 13(2). It is especially unfortunate because I believe that through prior consultation, this matter could potentially have been resolved and the misunderstanding implicit in your letter clarified.

The letter you mentioned did not impact upon security. The real events in the field, namely the killing of NGOs, were the events that influenced security. These events were being monitored by ICC security services.

I would appreciate it if you could restore the security service to the OTP staff in Kampala. I am ready to meet with you to discuss this matter. At this meeting, I can provide you with the chronology of the facts, and explore avenues to ensure that coordination continues to improve. I hope that our agreement to create a joint situation center will help to avoid such misunderstandings in the future.


