THE PRESIDENCY of the International Criminal Court (“the Court”),

NOTING the decision of Pre-Trial Chamber I, dated 29 January 2007, confirming the charges brought by the Prosecutor of the Court against Mr Lubanga Dyilo and committing him for trial (“the decision confirming the charges”),¹

NOTING articles 36, 38 and 39 of the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court (“the Statute”);

CONSIDERING article 61(11) of the Statute, pursuant to which the Presidency shall constitute a Trial Chamber once the charges have been confirmed, which shall be responsible for the conduct of subsequent proceedings,

CONSIDERING rule 130 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Criminal Court (“the Rules”), pursuant to which the Presidency shall refer the case to a Trial Chamber and transmit to it the decision confirming the charges and the record of the proceedings of the Pre-Trial Chamber;

CONSIDERING that the record of the proceedings before Pre-Trial Chamber I and the decision confirming the charges was transmitted, by the Registrar, to the Presidency on 14 February 2007, in accordance with rule 129 of the Rules;²

CONSIDERING the decision of the Presidency, dated 27 February 2007, to suspend transmission of the record of proceedings of Pre-Trial Chamber I to a Trial Chamber, until such time as new Defence Counsel is assigned to Mr Lubanga Dyilo and it is

determined that he/she has had adequate time to familiarise him/herself with the case,


