On 30 May 2007, the *Ordre des avocats de Paris* filed an "Application for intervention in the proceedings as *amicus curiae* by the *Ordre des avocats de Paris* under rule 103 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence"¹ ("Application") in which it requested to be granted leave to appear as *amicus curiae* and to submit a brief on the "question of resources reasonably necessary for the effective and efficient defence of Mr Thomas Lubanga Dyilo."²
2. The Chamber notes that the International Bar Association which had filed a similar application on 4 June 2007,³ withdrew it on 25 July 2007.⁴ The issue of the resources allocated to the defence for Mr Thomas Lubanga Dyilo was resolved by the Registrar on 14 June 2007⁵ and therefore, the issue on which the *Ordre des avocats de Paris* sought to intervene, is now moot. The Application is dismissed.


