**Decision on prosecution's request for extension of page limit**

1. The Trial Chamber is seized of a "Prosecution's request for extension of the page limit of the 'summary of presentation of evidence'" ("prosecution's request") filed on 4 December 2007 which requests an extension of the 20 pages page limit to 50 pages pursuant to Regulation 37(2) of the Regulations of the Court in order "to meet the criteria for the "summary of the presentation of evidence" as established by the Trial Chamber".<sup>1</sup>
2. The prosecution submits that the extension of page limit is necessary to "sufficiently inform the Trial Chamber and the Defence of the Prosecution's case for trial",<sup>2</sup> by making "specific reference to the witnesses it intends to call at trial and the other evidence it intends to rely upon, which is anticipated to result in a document that is footnote-heavy, thus adding to the number of pages".<sup>3</sup>
3. Following an order of the Chamber shortening the time-limit for any response to the prosecution's request,<sup>4</sup> the defence filed a response on 6 December 2007, which did not object to the prosecution's request.<sup>5</sup>
4. Pursuant to Regulation 37(2), which provides that "[t]he Chamber may, at the request of a participant, extend the page limit in exceptional circumstances", the Trial Chamber finds that the reasons stated in the request constitute exceptional circumstances and hereby grants the prosecution an extension of the 20 pages page limit to 50 pages for the filing of the "summary of presentation of evidence".


