PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER I of the International Criminal Court;

NOTING the Registry's "Report on the visit of Omar Hassan Al Bashir to Djibouti",¹ filed on 9 May 2011, whereby the Registrar informed the Chamber that, according to the media information available, Omar Al Bashir had attended the inauguration ceremony of Djibouti's President Ismael Omar Guelleh on 8 May 2011;

NOTING the warrants of arrest against Omar Al-Bashir issued by the Chamber respectively on 4 March 2009 and 12 July 2010 which are yet to be executed;²

NOTING that the Djibouti has an obligation to cooperate with the Court in relation to the enforcement of such warrants of arrest, which stems both from the United Nations Security Council Resolution 1593(2005)³, whereby the United Nations Security Council "urge[d] all States and concerned regional and other international organizations to cooperate fully" with the Court, and from article 87 of the Statute of the Court, to which Djibouti is a State Party;

CONSIDERING it appropriate to inform the Security Council of the United Nations as well as the Assembly of States Parties to the Rome Statute about the recent visit of Omar Al-Bashir to Djibouti, in order for them to take any action they may deem appropriate;

FOR THESE REASONS

INFORMS the Security Council of the United Nations and the Assembly of States Parties to the Rome Statute about Omar Al-Bashir's visit to Djibouti on 8 May 2011, in order for them to take any measure they may deem appropriate;
