

1. In accordance with Rule 132(2) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence Trial Chamber V(A) (the 'Chamber') will hold a status conference on 19 August 2013. The main purpose of the status conference is to discuss the conduct of the trial proceedings, including the duration of the prosecution case, as indicated in the Chamber's decision of 9 August 2013.<sup>1</sup> In addition, the Chamber will address other outstanding matters, such as the requests that notice be given to the accused pursuant to Regulation 55(2) of the Regulations of the Court.<sup>2</sup> Given that these issues relate, mainly, to procedural matters, the Chamber does not find the accused's attendance necessary.
  
2. In order to facilitate the preparation of the parties and the participants for the status conference, the Chamber issues the following agenda:
  - A. The length of the prosecution case and the average time per witness;**
  - B. The requests to give notice pursuant to Regulation 55(2);**
  - C. Other matters.**
  
3. The discussion of all agenda items will, in principle, take place in public session. The Chamber puts the parties and participants on notice that the status conference may need to continue after 19 August 2013.


