Trial Chamber VI ('Chamber') of the International Criminal Court, in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Bosco Ntaganda*, having regard to Article 64(6)(f) of the Rome Statute and Regulation 35(2) of the Regulations of the Court ('Regulations'), issues the following 'Decision on the Registry's request for an extension of time for consultations'.

- 1. On 6 February 2015, the Chamber issued the 'Decision on the victims' participation in trial proceedings', directing, *inter alia*, the Registry to file a report relevant to the victim representation system which should apply for the trial phase of this case, following consultation with the victims who participated in the confirmation stage, not later than 27 February 2015.²
- 2. On 19 February 2015, the Registry filed its request for an extension of 15 days for the submission of the report ('Request').³
- 3. The Office of the Prosecutor,⁴ the Defence⁵ and the Legal Representatives of Victims⁶ indicated that they do not oppose the Request.
- 4. In the Request, the Registry submits that 'although it is doing its utmost, there are serious difficulties which may prevent it from filing its report on time'.⁷

 These difficulties include, in particular, various technical and logistical issues.⁸
- 5. The Chamber recalls that Regulation 35(2) of the Regulations allows the Chamber to 'extend or reduce a time limit if good cause if shown'. In the circumstances, the Chamber is satisfied that the requisite criteria have been met. Noting, in particular, the nature of the report, the Chamber further finds
