TRIAL CHAMBER II ("the Chamber") of the International Criminal Court ("the Court"), in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Germain Katanga*, pursuant to regulation 35 of the Regulations of the Court ("the Regulations"), issues the following decision.

- 1. On 1 April 2015, the Chamber invited the parties and participants to file observations on the principles and procedures to be applied to reparations, by 30 April 2015 at the latest.¹
- 2. On 22 April 2015, the Trust Fund for Victims ("the TFV") filed a request for extension of time to submit observations to 13 May 2015 ("the Request").²
- 3. As stated in the first sentence of regulation 35(2) of the Regulations, a chamber may extend a time limit only if good cause is shown. According to the TFV, an additional two weeks would allow for the Board of Directors to review the draft and for the Secretariat to incorporate its suggestions.³ Thus, in the instant case, the Chamber finds that there is good cause to extend the time limit set for the TFV to submit its observations, to 15 May 2015.
- 4. In the circumstances, the Chamber is also of the view that the extension must be granted to the other parties and participants invited to submit observations and that it is therefore appropriate to grant an extension of the time limit for submitting consolidated responses.

ORDERS the Defence, the Legal Representative and the Registry to submit any consolidated response to the said observations by 12 June 2015 at 4 p.m.
