**Trial Chamber VI** ('Chamber') of the International Criminal Court, in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Bosco Ntaganda*, having regard to Articles 58(1), 60(3), 61(11) and 64(6)(a) of the Rome Statute ('Statute') and Rules 118 and 119 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, issues the following 'Sixth decision on Mr Ntaganda's interim release'.

- 1. On 26 February 2015, Mr Ntaganda's detention was reviewed and the Chamber ordered his continued detention ('Fifth Interim Release Decision'). <sup>1</sup> The procedural history of that decision is incorporated by reference here.
- 2. Pursuant to the Chamber's briefing schedule, <sup>2</sup> submissions were filed in advance of the present review of Mr Ntaganda's detention on 29 May 2015 by the defence team for Mr Ntaganda ('Defence'), <sup>3</sup> 4 June 2015 by the Prosecution, <sup>4</sup> 5 June 2015 by the Legal Representatives of Victims<sup>5</sup> and 12 June 2015 by the Defence a second time. <sup>6</sup>
- 3. The Chamber recalls that, under Article 60(3) of the Statute, a chamber may modify its previous ruling on detention, release or conditions of release if 'it is satisfied that changed circumstances so require'. The Chamber notes that none of the parties and participants has submitted that there were changed circumstances warranting a modification of the Fifth Interim Release Decision. In addition, the Chamber is not aware of any changed circumstances that have transpired which would now render necessary a modification of its prior ruling. The Chamber is also of the view that there is no need to consider conditional release at this point, as no proposals have been presented or are self-evident.
