**Trial Chamber VI** ('Chamber')<sup>1</sup> of the International Criminal Court, in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Bosco Ntaganda*, having regard to Article 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute ('Statute'), Rules 85, 89 and 90-92 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ('Rules') and Regulations 79-80 and 86 of the Regulations of the Court, and incorporating by reference the applicable law as set out in the 'Decision on victims' participation in trial proceedings' ('First Participation Decision'),<sup>2</sup> issues the 'Third decision on victims' participation in trial proceedings'.

1. On 6 February 2015, the Chamber issued its First Participation Decision,<sup>3</sup> whereby it established the procedure for the participation of victims in the present case.
2. On 16 June 2015, the Chamber issued its 'Second decision on victims' participation in trial proceedings' ('Second Participation Decision')<sup>4</sup> in which it admitted 1070 applicants as participating victims and decided, by majority, that the system of legal representation of victims adopted at the confirmation stage of the proceedings should be maintained during the trial proceedings.<sup>5</sup>
3. In accordance with the admission system set out in the First Participation Decision,<sup>6</sup> and after having individually assessed the applications on the basis of the guidance provided by the Chamber, the Registry transmitted, on 22 June 2015, a total of 1127 applications for participation: 1079 applications that it found clearly met the requirements of Rule 85(a) of the Rules ('Group A') and 48 applications it considers to clearly not meet these

requirements ('Group B').<sup>7</sup> On the same date, the Registry also filed the related assessment report.<sup>8</sup>

4. The Chamber has not identified any error in the Registry's assessment and thus: (i) authorises the participation of the 1079 Group A applicants; and (ii) directs that victim status not be granted to the 48 applicants whose applications were transmitted as Group B.<sup>9</sup>
5. Finally, in line with the majority decision in relation to the legal representation of victims,<sup>10</sup> the Chamber also decides that Ms Sarah Pellet shall represent the 156 child soldiers victims and Mr Dmytro Suprun shall represent the 923 victims of the UPC/FPLC attacks,<sup>11</sup> admitted by way of the present decision.

**FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY**

**DECIDES** to admit the applicants listed in Annex A as participating victims;



**INSTRUCTS** the Registry to transmit to the legal representatives of victims copies of the redacted and unredacted versions of the applications for participation submitted by victims they are hereby appointed to represent.
