Section Appeals Chamber THE PRESIDENCY of the International Criminal Court notes the "Decision on Defence request for leave to appeal the 'Decision on Defence requests seeking disclosure orders and a declaration of Prosecution obligation to record contacts with witnesses" dated 27 November 2015 and the "Document in support of the appeal on behalf of Mr Ntaganda against Trial Chamber VI's 'Decision on Defence requests seeking disclosure orders and a declaration of Prosecution obligation to record contacts with witnesses', ICC01/04-02/06-904" ("Appeal"), filed by the defence for Mr Bosco Ntaganda on 10 December 2015, in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Bosco Ntaganda* ("*Ntaganda* case").²

The Presidency recalls that, on 21 October 2015, it granted the request of Judge Silvia Fernández de Gurmendi for excusal from all pending and future appeals in the *Ntaganda* case.³ The Presidency recalls further that in the same decision, the remaining members of the Presidency granted President Fernández de Gurmendi's request to be excused from the deliberations of the Presidency on her replacement in the Appeals Chamber for all pending and future appeals in the *Ntaganda* case.⁴ Following the filing of the Appeal, on 11 December 2015, Judge Sanji Mmasenono Monageng assumed responsibilities as a member of the Presidency for the purpose of deliberating on the replacement of Judge Fernández de Gurmendi for the Appeal.

The Presidency notes article 39(1) and (2)(b)(i) of the Rome Statute, rule 38 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 12 and 15(1) of the Regulations of the Court ("Regulations").

The Presidency recalls that, on 21 October 2015, in accordance with the Presidency's policy of effecting the replacement of a judge by lot from a roster of eligible judges, Judge Fernández de Gurmendi was replaced in the Appeals Chamber by Judge Raul C. Pangalangan for the purpose of an appeal in the *Ntaganda* case.⁵ The Presidency further recalls its policy that a judge already designated by lot may be subsequently designated to sit on other appeals that arise in the same case.⁶
