**Trial Chamber IX** ('Chamber') of the International Criminal Court ('Court') issues the following 'Decision on Joint Agreed Facts Submission', in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Dominic Ongwen*, pursuant to Rule 69 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

- 1. On 1 July 2016, the Office of the Prosecutor and the defence for Mr Ongwen jointly submitted 23 agreed facts related to Mr Ongwen's background, the parentage of certain children, geographical facts, the meaning of certain acronyms and the occurrence of an attack on Pajule.<sup>1</sup> The parties request that the Chamber consider the agreed facts as proven.
- By 12 July 2016, no responses to this request were filed by the Legal Representatives of Victims.<sup>2</sup>
- 3. The Chamber welcomes the parties' efforts to reach agreed facts and hopes that they reach more agreements in the future. The Chamber grants the relief sought.

**CONSIDERS** the agreed facts in ICC-02/04-01/15-487-Conf-AnxA as proven.
