THE PRESIDENCY of the International Criminal Court notes that in a decision dated 4 May 2017, Trial Chamber I granted the defence of Mr Laurent Gbagbo and Mr Charles Blé Goudé leave to appeal its decision of 9 December 2016¹ in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Laurent Gbagbo and Charles Blé Goudé* ("*Gbagbo and Blé Goudé*").

On 18 September 2015, the Presidency, in its present composition, granted the requests of Judge Silvia Fernández de Gurmendi and Judge Christine Van den Wyngaert for excusal from all future appeals in *Gbagbo and Blé Goudé*.²

The Presidency recalls article 39(1) and (2)(b)(i) of the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court, rule 38 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulations 12 and 15(1) of the Regulations of the Court.

The Presidency further recalls that, on 15 July 2015, in accordance with the Presidency's policy of effecting the replacement of judges by lot from a roster of eligible judges, Judge Fernández de Gurmendi and Judge Van den Wyngaert were replaced in the Appeals Chamber by Judge Kuniko Ozaki and Judge Chang-ho Chung for the purpose of hearing an appeal in *Gbagbo and Blé Goudé*.³ The Presidency further recalls its policy that a judge already designated by lot may be subsequently designated to sit on other appeals under article 82 of the Rome Statute that arise in the same case.

The Presidency hereby decides, in the current circumstances, to temporarily attach Judge Ozaki and Judge Chung, currently assigned to the Trial and Pre-Trial Divisions respectively, to the Appeals Chamber for the purpose of hearing the appeal.

Accordingly, the Appeals Chamber shall be composed as follows for purposes of the appeal:
