I, Judge Navanethem Pillay, President of the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda
(the "Tribunal");

HAVING RECEIVED a request from Ignace Bagilishema ("Bagilishema") on 7 June 2001,
for the modification of his conditions of detention, pursuant to Rule 64 of the Tribunal's
Rules of Procedure and Evidence (the "Rules");


HAVING CONSIDERED that on 7 June 2001, Trial Chamber I¹ rendered its judgment in
the case of the Prosecutor versus Ignace Bagilishema, acquitting Bagilishema of all charges
against him;

HAVING CONSIDERED that the Order issued by Trial Chamber I for the immediate
release of Bagilishema, pursuant to Rule 99 (A) of the Rules was stayed, pending the
consideration of the Prosecutor's motion for a warrant of arrest, pursuant to Rule 99(B) of the
Rules (the Prosecutor's Motion");

HAVING CONSIDERED the Defence submission that Bagilishema is deeply concerned for
his safety and that he is at great risk if he were to be returned to the UNDF;

HEREBY ORDERS the detention of Ignace Bagilishema in an Annex to the UNDF,
pending a decision by Trial Chamber I on the Prosecutor's Motion.
