THE APPEALS CHAMBER of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Rwanda and Rwandan Citizens Responsible for Genocide and Other Such Violations Committed in the Territory of Neighbouring States between 1 January 1994 and 31 December 1994,

NOTING Rule 118(D) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence;


NOTING that for reasons of authorised Tribunal business Judge Shahabuddeen is unable to sit on the date scheduled for the delivery of the Judgement in the present case;

NOTING that, pursuant to Rule 15bis(A) of the Rules, where a Judge, for reasons of authorised Tribunal business, is unable to continue sitting in a part-heard case for a period which is likely to be of short duration, and the remaining Judges of the Chamber are satisfied that it is in the interests of justice to do so, those remaining Judges of the Chamber may order that the hearing of the case continue in the absence of that Judge for a period of not more than five working days;

CONSIDERING that the remaining Judges of the Appeals Chamber are satisfied that it is in the interests of justice for the hearing to continue, and for the Appeals Judgement to be delivered in the absence of Judge Shahabuddeen;

HEREBY ORDERS that a public hearing shall be held on Friday 9 July 2004 at 09h30 in Arusha to deliver the Judgement.
