THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA (“Tribunal”),

SITTING as Trial Chamber III, composed of Judges Dennis C. M. Byron, Presiding, Emile Francis Short and Gberdao Gustave Kam (“Chamber”), pursuant to Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (“Rules”);

NOTING “Joseph Nzirorera’s Motion for Modification of Protective Order: Timing of Disclosure” (“Motion”), filed by the Defence for the Accused Joseph Nzirorera (“Defence”) on 20 September 2005;


CONSIDERING the Response thereto, filed on 26 September 2005 and the Corrigendum, filed on 27 September 2005;

CONSIDERING that in its Motion, the Defence alleges that DCDMS requires at least 30 days advance submission of work schedules for investigators, which severely impedes its ability to conduct investigations to ensure adequate time for cross-examination;


CONSIDERING that to assess the said Motion, the Chamber needs to be in possession of all the relevant information;


ACCORDINGLY DIRECTS DCDMS to comment on the Defence allegation and to notify the Chamber and the parties of its procedure before an investigator can commence an investigation, no later than 21 October 2005.
