I, WOLFGANG SCHOMBURG, a Judge of the Appeals Chamber of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Rwanda and Rwandan Citizens Responsible for Genocide and Other Such Violations Committed in the Territory of Neighbouring States, between 1 January 1994 and 31 December 1994 ("Appeals Chamber" and "International Tribunal", respectively);

NOTING that the last status conference was held on 19 September 2005;

NOTING that Emmanuel Ndindabahizi ("Appellant") is currently in detention in the United Nations Detention Unit in Arusha pending appeal;

NOTING that pursuant to Rule 65bis (B) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules"), "[t]he Appeals Chamber or an Appeals Chamber Judge may convene a status conference";

CONSIDERING that it is in the interests of justice to allow a person in custody pending appeal the opportunity to raise issues in relation thereto, including the mental and physical condition of that person;

PURSUANT TO RULES 54 AND 65BIS (B) OF THE RULES

HEREBY ORDER that a status conference be held before the Pre-Appeal Judge in the presence of Emmanuel Ndindabahizi on 8 February 2006, at 13.00 pm, in Courtroom "Laïty Kama"; [1]

ORDER that Lead Counsel be present at the status conference;

DIRECT the Registrar to arrange for the necessary arrangements including translation services and to provide a full transcript of the status conference in French and English.
