



I, Liu Daqun, Judge of the Appeals Chamber of the International Criminal Tribuoal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Rwanda and Rwandan Citizens Responsible for Genocide and Other Such Violations Committed in the Territory of Neighbouring States, between 1 January and 31 December 1994 ("Tribunal") and Pre-Appeal Judge in this case am seized of a motion filed by Mr. Tharcisse Mnvunyi to accept the filing of his Response Brief out of time.¹ The Prosecution has not filed a response to this motion, but has informed the Appeals Chamber that it does not oppose it.

2. On 12 September 2006, Trial Chamber II convicted Mr. Muvunyi of three counts of genocide, direct and public incitement to commit genocide, and other inhumane acts as crimes against humanity, and sentenced him to twenty-five years' imprisonment.² On 12 October 2006, Mr. Muvunyi appealed against his convictions and sentence.³ The Prosecution also appealed against the Trial Judgement and filed its Appeal Brief on 15 December 2006.⁴ On 11 January 2007, Mr. Muvunyi requested an extension of time to file his response to the Prosecution Appeal Brief.⁵ This request was granted in part, and it was ordered that Mr. Muvunyi's Response Brief be filed no later than 12 March 2007.⁶ Mr. Muvunyi, however, filed his Response Brief on 28 March 2007.⁷

3. In the Motion, Mr. Muvunyi's counsel states that, when the Pre-Appeal Judge set the date for filing the Response Brief, he mistakenly considered this as the date for filing the Appellant's Brief.⁶ He notes that, instead of filing the Response Brief on 12 March 2007, on that date be sent the *Muvunyi* Appeal Brief to the Tribunal's Registry for filing.⁹ At the time, Mr. Muvunyi also had a pending request to extend the time for filing his Appellant's Brief, and his counsel states that he only realized the mistake when the Appeals Chamber issued its decision on 17 March 2007, allowing the late-filing of the Appeal Brief.¹⁰ The Motion requests the Appeals Chamber to accept

the late-filing of Mr. Muvunyi's Response Brief and not to penalize Mr. Muvunyi for the "honest mistake" of his counsel.¹¹

Rule 116(A) of the Rules permits the Appeals Chamber to extend a time limit upon a 4. showing of good cause. Moreover, Paragraph 19 of the Practice Direction on Procedure for the Filing of Written Submissions in Appeal Proceedings before the Tribunal allows the Appeals Chamber to "recognize as validly done any act done after the expiration of a time-limit so prescribed."12 The late-filing of the Response Brief appears to be inadvertent, which itself does not suffice to demonstrate good cause. However, the Prosecution has not opposed the present Motion, and any delay resulting from this late-filing will not impact the overall timing for the consideration of this appeal. Significantly, as the Prosecution appeal seeks to increase Mr. Muvunyi's sentence to life-imprisonment and to enter a new conviction against him for rape as a crime against humanity.¹³ in the present circumstances, it would be a miscarriage of justice not to consider Mr. Muvunyi's Response Brief based solely on this brief delay resulting from his counsel's inadvertence. Accordingly, in the context of this case, there is good cause to allow the late-filing of Mr. Muvunyi's Response Brief.¹⁴ Counsel, however, is reminded to adhere strictly to the deadlines set by the Tribunal and, forthermore, is warned that future professional lapses of this nature may not be similarly excused.

For the foregoing reasons, Mr. Muvunyi's motion to file his Response Brief out of time is 5. GRANTED.
