THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA ("Tribunal"),

SITTING as Trial Chamber II, composed of Judges Khalida Rachid Khan, presiding, and Judges Lee Gacumba Muthoga and Emile Francis Short, pursuant to Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules");

RECALLING the Trial Chamber's Decision of 24 June 2005 entitled "Decision on the Defence Motion for the Chamber to Visit Sites in Rwanda" in which the Chamber

DIRECT[ED] the Defence for Mugenzi and Bizimungu to renew their applications for site visits, after the commencement of the Defence case, precisely setting forth justifications for the proposed visits by the Chamber, in light of the allegations against the Accused, as well as a proposed itinerary for the visits;

NOTING that the Trial Chamber has now heard the defence cases for Accused persons Justin Mugenzi and Casimir Bizimungu;¹ that the defence case for Jérôme-Clément Bicamumpaka is ongoing; and the case for Prosper Mugiraneza is still to be heard;

NOTING FURTHER that the next trial session in this case, which is to commence on 28 January 2008, will run, almost continuously, until the remaining evidence in the case has been heard;²



CONSIDERING THEREFORE that any visit of sites in Rwanda undertaken by the Trial Chamber should take place as soon as practicable;

HEREBY ORDERS

- I. That the Defence for Justin Mugenzi and Casimir Bizimungu shall renew their applications for site visits, if they so wish, and that the remaining Defence teams, and the Prosecution, shall file any application for site visits it wishes to be considered by the Chamber, no later than 8 February 2008, precisely setting forth justifications for the proposed visits by the Chamber, in light of the allegations against the Accused, as well as a proposed itinerary for the visits; and
- II. That those Parties who wish to submit an application for site visit shall collaborate on a proposed itinerary for those visits insofar as it is practicable.
