1. On 2 March 2009, the Chamber decided to admit certain materials into evidence under Rule 89 (C) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence. In paragraph 5 of the Decision, the Chamber found Documents 4 and 6 to be inadmissible for lack of indicia of reliability. However, at the end of its Decision at page 8, the Chamber issued the following order:

[...]

DENIES the Defence Motion in respect of Documents 12, 17, and 18; and

REQUESTS the Registrar to assign Documents 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23 with exhibit numbers.

2. The Chamber mistakenly failed to deny the Defence Motion in respect of Documents 4 and 6 and requested the Registrar to assign them exhibit numbers. The Registrar duly assigned Documents 4 and 6 with exhibit numbers D101 and D103. These documents should not, however, have been admitted into evidence.

3. The Chamber therefore corrects its previous order and decides that it should read as follows:


[...]


DENIES the Defence Motion in respect of Documents 4, 6, 12, 17, and 18; and


REQUESTS the Registrar to assign Documents 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23 with exhibit numbers.”

4. In addition, the Chamber requests the Registrar to remove Exhibits D101 and D103 from the record.
