DECISION ON MATTHIEU NGIRUMPATSE'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE SUBMISSIONS PURSUANT TO THE SCHEDULING ORDER OF 12 JANUARY 2010

1. The next trial session in this case is scheduled to start on 18 January 2010 with the continuation of the presentation of the Defence case of Joseph Nzirorera. The session is scheduled to end on 18 March 2010.

2. On 12 January 2010, the Chamber directed the Parties to file submissions by e-mail on Matthieu Ngirumpate's ability to participate in full-day proceedings by Saturday 16 January 2010.¹

3. On 13 January 2010, Matthieu Ngirumpatse filed a motion seeking extension of time to file submissions as Counsel are scheduled to only arrive in Arusha in the night of 16 January 2010 and want to discuss the issue *viva voce* with his counsel.²

4. In its Order of 12 January 2010, the Chamber indicated its intention to rule on the issue on 18 January 2010 and it had scheduled to direct the Parties to exceptionally file submissions on Saturday 16 January 2010 by 6:00 p.m. to take into account Matthieu Ngirumpatse's wish to discuss *viva voce* the issue with his Counsel. Consequently, the Chamber considers that it should allow Matthieu Ngirumpatse to file submissions on Sunday 17 January 2010 after having met with his Counsel.

5. Moreover, the Chamber considers that Counsel for the Accused persons should make the necessary arrangements to ensure they arrive in Arusha in a timely fashion before the beginning of trial sessions to be prepared to any unforeseen circumstance.

FOR THE ABOVE REASONS, THE CHAMBER

GRANTS IN PART Matthieu Ngirumpatse's Motion for extension of time;

REQUESTS the Registry to make arrangements in order for Matthieu Ngirumpatse to meet with his Counsel on Sunday 17 January 2010;
