
DECISION ON GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA'S REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE AMICUS CURIAE BRIEF PURSUANT TO CHAMBER'S INVITATION

- 1. On 30 June 2010, the Accused Jean-Bosco Uwinkindi was arrested in Uganda. He was transferred to the United Nations Detention Facility ("UNDF") in Arusha, Tanzania on 2 July 2010.¹
- 2. On 04 November 2010, the Prosecution, pursuant to Rule 11 bis of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules"), filed a Motion requesting that the case of the *Prosecutor v. Jean Uwinkindi* be referred to the authorities of the Republic of Rwanda for trial in the High Court of Rwanda ("11 bis Motion").²
- 3. On 26 November 2010, the President designated Trial Chamber II, as composed of Judge Florence Rita Arrey (presiding), Judge Emile Francis Short and Judge Robert Fremr, to decide the Prosecution's 11 *bis* Motion.³
- 4. On 18 January 2011, the Trial Chamber invited the Government of Rwanda to appear as *amicus curiae* in the present case.⁴
- 5. On 28 January 2011, the Prosecutor General on behalf of the Republic of Rwanda filed a Motion asking for an extension of time to file its *amicus curiae* brief, stating that they have been working on compiling the relevant information in response to the issues specified by this Chamber in its invitation dated 18 January 2011.⁵
- 6. The Government of Rwanda submits that the information required by the Chamber is maintained by different government agencies and departments thus requiring time for the coordination in the assembly and compilation thereof into a unified response.⁶

- 7. The C tamber notes that the Government of Rwanda requests an extension time of ten days (up t 18 February 2011) to file its brief. This is comparable to the request filed by the Humar Rights Watch for extension of time which the Chamber had granted on 28 January 2011
- 8. The Chamber finds that the granting of an extension of time shall not interfere with the expeditious conduct of the proceedings in this case but shall rather, give the Government of Rwanda sufficient time to complete its compilation of the relevant information sought by the Chamber. It further considers that granting this time extension of ten days will serve the interests of justice in the instant case.

FOR THES E REASONS, THE REFERRAL BENCH

GRANT 3 the Request for Extension of Time.
