

1. On 7 February the Prosecutor filed a motion requesting the preservation of evidence by special deposition for a future trial pursuant to Rule 71 *bis* (A) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.¹
2. Acting pursuant to Rule 71 *bis* (C), the President shall refer the matter to a Trial Chamber and instruct the Registrar to appoint Duty Counsel pursuant to Rule 44 *bis* to represent the interests of the Accused.

FOR THESE REASONS, THE PRESIDENT

- I. **DESIGNATES** Trial Chamber III composed of Judge Dennis C. M. Byron, Gberdao Gustave Kam and Vagn Joensen to adjudicate on the Prosecution's Motion; and
- II. **INSTRUCTS** the Registrar to immediately appoint Duty Counsel pursuant to Rule 44 *bis* to represent the interests of Félicien Kabuga.
