

ORDER FOR SUBMISSIONS

Rule 71 bis (D) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence

1. On 7 February 2011, the Prosecution filed a motion requesting the preservation of evidence by special deposition for a future trial pursuant to Rule 71 *bis* (A) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.¹ On 15 February 2011, the President of the Tribunal appointed this Chamber to rule on the Prosecutor's request and instructed the Registrar to appoint Duty Counsel pursuant to Rule 44 *bis* to represent the interests of Félicien Kabuga.²

2. Pursuant to Rule 71 *bis* (D), the Chamber shall hear the Parties in a closed session to determine whether to grant the Prosecution's request that evidence relating to the Indictment be preserved for a future trial by special deposition as stated at sub-rule (E). The Chamber decides to hear the Parties in writing.

FOR THESE REASONS, THE CHAMBER

- I. ORDERS the Parties to file submissions under confidential cover within 14 days of the appointment of Duty Counsel to represent the interests of Félicien Kabuga.
- II. ORDERS that any response be filed within 3 days of the filing of the submissions.
- **III. DIRECTS** the Registry to provide the Duty Counsel with the relevant documents to fulfil his mission on appointment.
