**WARRANT OF ARREST  
ORDER FOR SURRENDER**

**To: The Prosecutor of the International Tribunal**



I, Judge Almiro Simões Rodrigues, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal);

**CONSIDERING** United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 of 25 May 1993, and Articles 19(2) and 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal ("Statute"), and Rules 54 to 1 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal ("Rules");

**CONSIDERING** the indictment submitted by the Prosecutor against MILAN LUKIĆ and confirmed by me, a Judge of the International Tribunal, on the 26 October 1998, a copy of which is annexed to this warrant of arrest;

**HEREBY DIRECT** the Prosecutor or her representatives to search for, arrest and surrender to the International Tribunal:


**MITAR VASILJEVIĆ**, son of Ljubisav, born 25 August 1954, in the village of Đurevići, Višegrad municipality. Before the war, he worked as a waiter at the Hotel Panos in Višegrad. After the war started, **MITAR VASILJEVIĆ** joined Milan Lukić's paramilitary unit. **MITAR VASILJEVIĆ** currently resides in Višegrad and works as a waiter at a restaurant in the former Višegradanka department store.

Alleged to have committed in the territory of Republic of Bosnia Herzegovina, from in or about April 1992 through in or about October 1994, Violations of the Laws or Customs of War, punishable under Article 3 of the Statute and Crimes against Humanity, punishable under Article 5 of the Statute.

And to advise the said **MITAR VASILJEVIĆ** at the time of his arrest, and in a language he understands, of his rights as set forth in Article 21 of the Statute and, *mutatis mutandis*, in Rules 42 and 43 of the Rules which are annexed hereto, and of his right to remain silent, and to caution him that any statement he makes shall be recorded and may be used in evidence. The indictment and review of the indictment (and all other documents annexed to the present warrant) must also be brought to the attention of the accused.

**REQUEST THAT** the Prosecutor or her representatives, upon the arrest of **MITAR VASILJEVIĆ**, promptly notify the Registrar of the International Tribunal, for the purposes of his transfer pursuant to Rule 57 of the Rules.
