ORDER TO THE REPUBLIC OF CROATIA FOR THE PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS

THIS TRIAL CHAMBER of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia Since 1991 ("the International Tribunal"),

NOTING the Prosecutor's Application for an Order to the Republic of Croatia for the Production of Documents, with a confidential annex attached ("the Annex"), filed by the Office of the Prosecutor ("the Prosecution") on 24 July 1998, and the Prosecutor's Memorandum in Support of Request for Order to Republic of Croatia for the Production of Documents, filed *ex parte* and under seal by the Prosecution on 24 July 1998,

NOTING the Opposition of the Republic of Croatia to the Prosecutor's Application for an Order to the Republic of Croatia for the Production of Documents, filed *ex parte* and under seal by counsel for the Republic of Croatia on 28 August 1998,

NOTING the Prosecutor's Request to set the Prosecutor's 24 July 1998 Application for an Order to the Republic of Croatia for Hearing on 8 January 1999, filed by the Prosecution on 18 December 1998, and the Response of the Republic of Croatia to the Prosecutor's Request to Set the Prosecutor's 24 July 1998 Application for an Order to the Republic of Croatia for Hearing on 8 January 1999, filed by counsel for the Republic of Croatia on 5 January 1999,

NOTING the arguments of the Parties heard in closed session on 8 January 1999,

CONSIDERING the Appeals Chamber Judgement on the Request of the Republic of Croatia for Review of the Decision of Trial Chamber II of 18 July 1997, in *Prosecutor v. Blaskić*, Case No. IT-95-14-T, of 29 October 1997, in which the Appeals Chamber specified the following conditions for an order for the production of documents: "Any request for an order for production of documents issued under Article 29, paragraph 2, of the Statute, whether before or after the commencement of a trial, must: (1) identify specific documents and not broad categories. . . . ; (2) set out succinctly the reasons why such documents are deemed relevant to the trial. . . . ; (3) not be unduly onerous. . . . ; (4) give the requested State sufficient time for compliance. . . . ",

CONSIDERING that those conditions are mandatory and cumulative,

CONSIDERING that some of the documents sought by the Prosecution in the Annex are not

relevant to this case, and that for others, no reasons have been given as to why the documents are "deemed relevant",

CONSIDERING, however, that two of the requests set out in the Annex, IV and V, are relevant to this trial as they relate to the facts charged in the Indictment and meet the other criteria set by the Appeals Chamber,

CONSIDERING also the requirement to set reasonable and workable deadlines for compliance with an order for the production of documents,

PURSUANT TO Article 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal and Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence

ORDERS the Republic of Croatia to disclose to the Prosecution the documents listed in confidential Annex A as soon as possible and no later than within sixty days of the date of this order.
