**WARRANT OF ARREST  
ORDER FOR SURRENDER**

---

**To: The Federal Republic of Yugoslavia**

I, Judge Richard George May, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“International Tribunal”);

**CONSIDERING** United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 of 25 May 1993, and Articles 19(2) and 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal (“Statute”), and Rules 54 to 61 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal (“Rules”);

**CONSIDERING** the indictment submitted by the Prosecutor against **ŽELJKO RAŽNJATOVIĆ, also known as “ARKAN”**, and confirmed by Judge Mohamed Shahabuddeen, a Judge of the International Tribunal, on the 30th day of September 1997, charging him with committing serious violations of international humanitarian law on the territory of the former Yugoslavia, in particular under Articles 2, 3 and 5 of the Tribunal’s Statute;

**HEREBY DIRECT** the authorities of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia to search for, arrest, detain and surrender to the International Tribunal:

**ŽELJKO RAŽNJATOVIĆ**, also known as “**ARKAN**”, born in 1952, in Brezice, Slovenia;

And to advise the said **ŽELJKO RAŽNJATOVIĆ** at the time of his arrest, and in a language he understands, of his rights as set forth in Article 21 of the Statute and, *mutatis mutandis*, in Rules 42 and 43 of the Rules which are annexed hereto, and of his right to remain silent, to caution him that any statement he makes shall be recorded and may be used in evidence and to bring to his attention the fact that he has been indicted for serious violations of international humanitarian law committed on the territory of the former Yugoslavia;

**REQUEST THAT** the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, upon the arrest of **ŽELJKO RAŽNJATOVIĆ**, promptly notify the Registrar of the International Tribunal, for the purposes of his transfer to the International Tribunal pursuant to Rule 57 of the Rules.

**REQUEST THAT** the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia report forthwith to the Registrar of the International Tribunal if it is unable to execute the present warrant of arrest, indicating the reasons for its inability pursuant to Rule 59(A) of the Rules.
