**WARRANT OF ARREST  
ORDER FOR SURRENDER**

**To: The Republic of Austria**

I, David Anthony Hunt, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“the International Tribunal”);

**CONSIDERING** United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 of 25 May 1993, and Articles 19(2) and 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal (“the Statute”), and Rules 54 to 61 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal (“the Rules”);

**CONSIDERING** the indictment submitted by the Prosecutor against Momir TALIC and confirmed by Judge Almiro Simões Rodrigues, a Judge of the International Tribunal, on the fourteenth day of March 1999, a copy of which is annexed to this warrant of arrest;

**HEREBY DIRECT** the authorities of the Republic of Austria to search for, arrest and surrender to the International Tribunal:


Momir TALIĆ, born 15 July 1942. Currently a General in the Army of Republika Srpska and serving as the Chief of the General Staff.

Alleged to have committed in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, between 1 April 1992 and 31 December 1992, a Crime Against Humanity, punishable under Articles 5 and 7(1) and 7(3) of the Tribunal Statute;

And to advise the said Momir TALIĆ at the time of his arrest, and in a language he understands, of his rights as set forth in Article 21 of the Statute and, *mutatis mutandis*, in Rules 42 and 53 of the Rules which are annexed hereto, and of his right to remain silent, and to caution him that any statement he makes shall be recorded and may be used in evidence. The indictment and review of the indictment (and all other documents annexed to the present warrant) must also be brought to the attention of the accused.

**REQUEST THAT** the Republic of Austria, upon the arrest of Momir TALIĆ, promptly notify the Registrar of the International Tribunal for the purposes of his transfer to the International Tribunal pursuant to Rule 57 of the Rules.

**REQUEST THAT** the Republic of Austria report forthwith to the Registrar of the International Tribunal if it is unable to execute the present warrant of arrest, indicating the reasons for its inability pursuant to Rule 59(A) of the Rules.
