ORDER FOR NON-DISCLOSURE OF ARREST WARRANT

I, DAVID ANTHONY HUNT, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("the International Tribunal"),

HAVING REVIEWED an indictment, IT-99-36-I, confirmed by Judge Almiro Simões Rodrigues, on 14 March 1999 pursuant to Articles 18 and 19 of the Statute, and Rules 28 and 47 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

AND BEING SEISED of an "Application for a Warrant of Arrest and for an Order of Non-disclosure" of the Prosecutor dated 23 August 1999,

HAVING HEARD the Prosecutor pursuant to Rules 53, 54, and 55 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("the Rules") on 23 August 1999,

HAVING ISSUED a warrant of arrest for the Accused, Momir TALIĆ, to the Republic of Austria,

PURSUANT TO Article 19(2) of the Statute of the International Tribunal and Rules, 53, 54, and 55 of the Rules,
