**TO: THE PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL**

**I, Rafael Nieto-Navia**, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal"), in Chambers,

**CONSIDERING** United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 of 25 May 1993, and Articles 19(2) and 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal ("Statute"), and Rules 54 to 61 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal;

**CONSIDERING** the amended Indictment submitted by the Prosecutor against **ZORAN VUKOVIĆ** and confirmed by me, a Judge of the International Tribunal, on the 7<sup>th</sup> of October 1999;

**HEREBY DIRECT** the Prosecutor or her representatives to search for, arrest and surrender to the International Tribunal:


**ZORAN VUKOVIĆ**, son of Milojica, born on 6 September 1955 in the village of Brusna, municipality of Foča, and permanent resident of Foča. He worked as a waiter and had lived in Herceg Novi, Montenegro, and was one of the sub-commanders of the military police and a paramilitary leader in Foča;

Who is alleged to have committed in the territory of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina, between April 1992 and February 1993: Crimes against Humanity and Violations of the Laws or Customs of War, within the competence of the International Tribunal by virtue of Articles 3 and 5 of the Statute; and

To advise the said **ZORAN VUKOVIĆ** at the time of his arrest, and in a language he understands, of his rights as set forth in Article 21 of the Statute and, *mutatis mutandis*, in Rules 42 and 43 which are set out below, and of his right to remain silent, and to caution him that any statement he makes shall be recorded and may be used in evidence. The indictment and review of the indictment (and all other documents annexed to the present warrant) must also be brought to the attention of the accused.

**REQUEST THAT** the Prosecutor or her representatives, upon the arrest of **ZORAN VUKOVIĆ**, promptly notify the Registrar of the International Tribunal for the purposes of his transfer pursuant to Rule 57;
