DECISION TO VACATE IN FULL THE ORDER FOR
NON-DISCLOSURE OF 26 OCTOBER 1998

I, Judge Richard May, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991 ("International Tribunal"),

CONSIDERING the order of Judge Almiro Simões Rodrigues on 26 October 1998, which ordered the non-disclosure of the indictment IT-98-32-I,

CONSIDERING the order of Judge Wang Tieya on 25 January 2000, that the order of non-disclosure of 26 October 1998 be vacated in part upon the arrest of the accused Mitar VASILJEVIĆ,


CONSIDERING the order of Judge Almiro Simões Rodrigues on 11 February 2000, that the order of non-disclosure of 26 October 1998 be vacated in part to allow the arrest warrants of the two accused still at large, Milan LUKIĆ and Sredoje LUKIĆ, to be served upon the government of Republika Srpska,

CONSIDERING the Motion of the Prosecutor to Vacate in Full the Order for Non-disclosure of 26 October 1998 filed on 30 October 2000; in particular, the submission that to date all efforts to secure the arrest of Milan LUKIĆ and Sredoje LUKIĆ have been unsuccessful,

CONSIDERING that it is appropriate to unseal the indictments against Milan LUKIĆ and Sredoje LUKIĆ so that all possibilities to secure their arrest may be employed,

PURSUANT TO Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the Tribunal;

ORDER that the Order for Non-disclosure of 26 October 1998 be vacated in full to allow the public disclosure of the indictment.
