**WARRANT OF ARREST
ORDER FOR SURRENDER**

To: The Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), in particular to the authorities of the Republic of Montenegro.

I, Judge Liu Daqun, Judge of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (“International Tribunal”);

CONSIDERING United Nations Security Council Resolution 827 of 25 May 1993, and Articles 19(2) and 29 of the Statute of the International Tribunal (“Statute”) and Rules 54 to 61 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence of the International Tribunal (“Rules”);

CONSIDERING the Prosecutor’s notification to the Registrar that there is information or a reasonable belief that the accused resides, or was last known to be, or is believed to be likely to be found in the territory or under the jurisdiction of the entities to which this warrant is transmitted and that the authorities of the Republic of Montenegro intend to assist with the execution of the Arrest Warrant (“Notification”);

CONSIDERING that the Notification by the Prosecutor is a proper basis for the Registrar to believe that the accused resides, or was last known to be, or is believed to be likely to be found in the territory or under the jurisdiction of the entities to which this warrant is transmitted;

HEREBY DIRECT the authorities of the entities to which this warrant of arrest and order for surrender is transmitted to search for, arrest and surrender to the International Tribunal:

Radovan KARADŽIĆ born on 19 June 1945 in the municipality of Šavnik, presently Republic of Montenegro, former President of the Serbian Democratic Party, former President of the Presidency of the Serbian Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina and former President of Republika Srpska;

Alleged to have committed in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, between 1 July 1991 and 19 July 1996: Genocide, Crimes Against Humanity, Violations of the Laws or Customs of War, And Grave Breaches Of the Geneva Conventions of 1949, punishable under Articles 2,3,4,5 and 7(1) and 7(3) of the Statute of the International Tribunal;


And to advise the said **Radovan KARADŽIĆ** at the time of his arrest, in a language that he understands, of his rights set forth in Article 21 of the Statute and, *mutatis mutandis*, in Rules 42 and 43 of the Rules which are annexed hereto, of his right to remain silent, and to caution him that any statement he makes shall be recorded and may be used in evidence. The indictment and review of the indictment (and all other documents annexed to the present warrant) must also be brought to the attention of the accused;

REQUEST THAT the authorities of the entities to which this warrant of arrest and order for surrender is transmitted, upon the arrest of **Radovan KARADŽIĆ**, promptly notify the Registrar of the International Tribunal, for the purposes of his transfer;

REQUEST THAT the authorities of the entities to which this warrant of arrest and order for surrender is transmitted, report forthwith to the

Registrar of the International Tribunal if they are unable to execute the present warrant of arrest, indicating the reasons for its inability.
